The Source of True Peace and Joy!

Part I

By doing one's own Bible study, which pastors greatly fear of anyone in their congregations ever doing, and by simply rightly dividing a King James 1611 Bible, one can easily locate the sources of true everlasting joy and a peace that passeth all understanding so that we may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost, all coming from a rightly divided King James Bible — with no personal feelings or inner 'leadings' tricking anyone into giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils. (Romans 15:13, Philippians 4:7; I Timothy 4:1)

This series will show readers that the source of this joy and peace comes only from within the inspired and preserved Scriptures – the King James Bible only.

Of course we know the original source is the risen Christ Himself... and that He passed it on to Paul who passed it on to us through a King James 1611 Bible, which has been available for free bible study for over 400 years... and yet has been under constant attack (even before it was finally printed) to this very day as well as in the days to come. In fact, this attack has progressed to the point that it is getting harder and harder to find an honest, inspired and preserved KJB from which to study. (Amos 8:11,12).

For many reasons, reasons that I won't take the time now to list, I see that 'Christians' today have no idea what true joy and peace is nor could they even find it all – if they would ever become interested. They basically think their joy and peace is based on their own 'good works now that they say they are saved, and/or they say that because Jesus just loves them as much as He loves everyone, they don't even wonder or worry about their walk or knowledge. They simply throw in those occasional and often tearful confessions of guilt during church 'invitations' and then let their pastor take care of everything else.

Everyone is just too busy to read let alone study a bible! In fact, NONE of their modern bibles even tell them to study the Scriptures so why would they even consider doing their own reading and studying! Well, they don't! They simply but sadly err because they do not know the Scriptures. Just like the Jews in Moses' day, their leaders caused them to err! Then, in Jesus' day they erred as Jesus spoke to them the Scriptures and now the Gentiles under Paul's apostleship they continue to err through corrupt scriptures,, not knowing the scriptures. (Matthew 22:29, II Corinthians 2:17)

... and yet, if a certain world renown humorous with a tough pulpit talk mostly 'because he is height disadvantaged' evangelist tells them to read their bible 10 pages a day, they will at least try do what they can to do so to feel good about themselves – and even call

themselves a Bible-believer – even it means missing all the content in those ten pages. I have seen them even buy smaller bibles so those ten pages aren't as much to read as in their larger bible.

Unfortunately, as you will see in this particular study, today's modern Christianity is really all about preparing the people for the coming of the antichrist. Because few, if any Christians will even consider simply reading a KJB and applying "Paul Only," we are saddened by an awareness that we have knowing that they are all missing so much understanding and joy while at the same time, they continue acting like they are better Christians in their walk as the Jews were in the wilderness and in their history.

I do believe that most so-called Christians today, when serious 'thinking time' arrives for them (when they are super sick, lives fall apart, etc. or even when they put their head on their pillow at night), they really have no comforting assurance from anything.

Their only hope is based on **1)** false teachings, **2)** profane and vain babblings, **3)** evil men and seducers that are waxing worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived, and in their own walk, which they know isn't good enough, always fearful if they confessed EVERYTHING enough!

They 'will not' endure sound doctrine and only want to heap to themselves teachers who will scratch their itching ears to say what they want to hear from those preachers and teachers who with their good words and fair speeches deceive the hearts of the simple. Whether they are aware or not, they are just part of Satan's conspiracy against Paul's teachings (Acts 23:12,13+) as well as part of Satan's army (Revelation 16:14) being gathered through the subtle lies to fight against the very Saviour they think they belong to. While the devil himself is not on this earth yet, he certainly is doing all he can to create and build up his own kingdom above the heights of the clouds, wanting to be like the most High (Isaiah 14:14) using the modern 'Christian' pastor to do his dirty work. But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived. Men of corrupt minds, reprobate concerning the faith... who concerning the truth have erred... etc. (II Timothy 2:18; 3:8,13)

The Question: So, what does it mean when Paul says no fornicators, adulterers and uncleanness can enter Heaven. Even though we are saved now, we are still sinning all the time because of this awful flesh we still live in.

Ok, here ya go: This is such marvelous stuff – get a 'handle' on this and nothing should drag you down ...unless you choose to allow life to drag you down. (see II Corinthians 4:8,9).

Bunny Trail: I want to remind you that Corinthians also must be 'rightly divided' even within itself. If you don't recognize that, you can fall into the trap of the Pentecostals and their being led by the Holy Spirit WITHOUT the need and use of the King James Bible.

A quick summary: In Corinthians, Paul is speaking to the Jews/Gentiles in a time BEFORE the King James Bible was produced. It was taking place BEFORE the time Paul was referring to in I Corinthians 13:8-13. So when 'that which is perfect' comes about, then all that being 'led in the Spirit, tongues, etc. (see verse 8)' which was being done during Corinthians time – they had no written scriptures yet - will be done away. So, after the KJB came onto the scene, what Paul talks about in Corinthians to the Gentiles today only comes from reading, understanding, etc. the King James Bible. (being referred to in verse 10.)

If you have a need for more detail on this particular subject 'that which is perfect,' you can ask me in an email or find sermons on this in my website. I will gladly explain this to anyone at any time. Naturally, most pastors disagree with me, but there is only ONE possibility for verse 10 in that it must be referring to the KJB, not Jesus Christ Himself.

So anyway, back onto the original trail, again!

As I was saying before I snuck off the trail again (something I ALWAYS enjoyed doing in my audio sermons) getting a handle on the answer to today's question will most assuredly explain II Corinthians 4:7-11 for and TO us today!

For now, let's us just touch on **verses 8,9**. I will explain the rest of those verses later. **We** are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed;

So, if we can honestly and personally cling to verses 8,9, then as this country continues to go berserk (as fittingly described in Romans 1:22-32), we will not need to feel bad or jealous, etc. when other people, especially so-called Christians, say they are just a happy critter – not letting anything bother them as the world around them falls apart on an hourly basis today! Remember, their peace is a false peace – based on their own conceit – and is a hopeless one as well as a temporary one.

YOU and I can have the true joy and peace as found only in a KJB1611.

Ok – continuing on... What was the question again? So, what does it mean when Paul says no fornicators, adulterers and uncleanness can enter Heaven. Even though we are saved now, we are still sinning all the time because of this awful flesh we still live in.

Right! Ok... I got it! Let's go!

Well, first of all, Paul is correct when he says no fornicators, adulterers, etc. And in your own time, I would suggest you do some word studies on *uncleanness*, *fornicators*, *adulterers*, etc. along with the word *inherit*. I also hope you understand the differences, etc. between the *kingdom of heaven* and the *kingdom of God*. Those word studies would fill you in on a few things that are important for this topic that I just can't get all in for now.

However, I am just going to stick with the basic thought in the question which is, "When we do wrong... when we are still sinning... how can we still go to heaven like Paul states?

Man, there is so much that be said here – ya know, simply reading Paul's books from Acts 9 all the way to Philemon over and over again and again will answer ANY and ALL your questions.

While I always remind people to read from **Genesis** to **Revelation**, because those books are great for past, present and future truth and awareness... for your personal and doctrinal application TODAY, concentrate on Paul's books.

Paul's books can all be read in just a few days. They can be read over and over, and I sincerely can guarantee your understanding will deepen every time, thanks to the Holy Spirit as you read.

And I don't mean 10 pages a day, etc. Take your time – concentrate – pay attention to what you read. You don't have to take copious notes... but jotting down some exciting thoughts wouldn't hurt, either. I would suggest you concentrate on Romans, Ephesians, Colossians and Philippians, especially in your 'early' reading. I II Timothy and Titus when you are ready to seek sound doctrine for your daily manner of life. While those "T" books tend to shake up people today, they gave joy to Paul's people in his time. If you can read Timothy and Titus and have joy in your reading, especially you ladies, wives and women out there, then you are doing great!

Oops – that was another bunny trail, but at least it was a shorter one this time.

Ok, so take note that Paul says no fornicators, adulterers, etc. Please note that in other verses, Paul ALSO includes idolaters, effeminate, abusers of themselves with mankind, thieves, covetous, drunkards, revilers, extortioners. You will also read of lasciviousness,

covetousness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence. He even mentions liars and if there 'be any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine.' Ouch! If you look hard enough, you can even find more 'titles' for this list. Surely, you are 'labeled' in at least one of those nasty and evil deeds, correct?

So now that we find that when Paul said in Romans 3:23 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; he knew what he was talking about!

And in my own observations of 'Christians' today, I see so many of them thinking they are now being 'blessed' by God because they are such good Christians – and will even say that when they do mess up – as rare as it is, but it does happen, they say, they simply confess their sins according to I John, and God blesses them more and more. They really think Romans 3:23 doesn't apply to them anymore. While it does not apply directly, of course, there still is a ring of truth for Christians – as you will see as you continue.

So honestly, these people believe that because they have God now and call themselves 'born-again' etc. they believe they suddenly have the power to live that 'sinningless' life (of course, with a few mistakes... but they just give their little confession during their church invitation).

Wow, aren't they just wonderful Christian people, especially when you consider that Adam and Eve couldn't do it; Abraham couldn't do it; Moses couldn't do it; David couldn't do it; the 'Twelve' couldn't do it; the Jewish people themselves couldn't do it. While in fact all the people during the Tribulation and will be required to follow the law, but only a few will be able; and if you can believe this, many will still choose not to do it during the Millennium! However, pastors continue to preach to their congregations that Christians today can and should do it all properly to be good enough for God's blessings so they can in turn bless their local assembly with their financial blessings, as well.

Listen pastors, even PAUL couldn't do it. Just read Romans 7:14-25. That, my friend, is the crux to the answer to the original question. Nowhere will you find it stated any better than verses 14-25. Read it over and over – slowly – memorize it. GET IT!

- 1) To find yourself described, read verses 15-16; 19, 21-23.
- 2) To see what Paul thought of his daily walk, read verses 24-25.
- 3) Then to read why this still happens to us today, as it did to Paul, read verses 17 and 20. Circle underline highlight those last two verses 17,20. It is not us that is doing all that junk it is sin that dwelleth in us.

That, my friends, is one of the many main differences that I have seen with today's modern pastors, who are so aptly described by Paul in **Timothy**. With them rejecting 'Paul ONLY,' they do not teach the mystery as given to Paul ONLY! Their congregations are ignorant of what Paul teaches – they are *ignorant of the blindness that has happened to*

Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in. As a result of that ignorance, they are wise in their own conceits. See **Romans 11:25**.

So, these people in churches today – any of the denominations, large or small, Baptist and bible believing Baptists included – who do not get preached and taught Paul ONLY for today's application other than a smattering or two of a few verses in Ephesians (pastors don't dare teach **Timothy** and **Titus**!!), are basically **WISE IN THEIR OWN CONCEITS**.

Now let's look at that sin that dwelleth in us. How can sin be in us but us not be part of it? Ok, turn to Colossians 2:11,12. We call it spiritual circumcision, the circumcision of Christ, the circumcision made without hands and/or the operation of God. Simply put... our body of the sins of the flesh is put off – cut away – separated from us. We were dead IN our sins as we were part of the uncircumcised flesh. But now, because we are cut away from our flesh, we are quickened together with him.

Read about the sword that God uses:

Hebrews 4:12 - For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. Ephesians 6:17b... and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:

So, the stuff that we still do that is wrong, sin, etc. is not us that is doing it. It is sin that is still in us that does all this evil stuff.

We can add even more to that by going to **Romans 6**. Read the following comments one at a time, then read **Romans 6** slowly. It will all make sense – it will all come together for you.

- 1. We cannot continue in sin! We are now DEAD to sin. It isn't talking about sinning we are dead to sin period! 'Sin' is not an issue with us anymore period!
- 2. We are now alive unto God because we are dead unto sin. While we can still choose to follow that sin in us, it isn't 'us' doing the sinning.
- 3. We are under grace, not the law. Of course, we should choose NOT to follow that sin in us but when we do, it still isn't us doing it.

So, does that mean we can just choose to yield to that sin in us? Well, technically and in all reality, we can, but 'God forbid' that we would choose to do so. But we do, and as Paul also did. This is our life now – fighting that sin that dwelleth within us. No wonder Paul wanted out! No wonder Paul says what he says in Romans 7:24,25... O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus

Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

Now, read all of Romans 7:14-25 again. Does it all make even more sense to you now?

Bunny Trail Note: We are not SET FREE from sin to stop sinning like all the modern christians and pastors teach... but we are *MADE FREE* from sin! That is a HUGE difference. See Romans 6:18, 22.

So, do you see, that knowing that the wages of sin is death, we see we can no longer 'die' that second death because we are *dead to sin*!

Bonus: remember II Corinthians 5:17 – Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. Maybe now this verse makes even more sense to you now, too. All things ARE become new does not say 'were' or 'will be' – it says ARE become new. So, every second of our day, we are 'new' – we are clean. Nothing is imputed. We are dead to sin... We are MADE FREE!

(Remember this thought if you like grammar, in this case in Romans, **sin** is a 'noun,' not a 'verb!' — and we are cut away from it now — we are quickened... NOT bornagain. Being 'born-again' is a bogus term. That is referring to Israel as a nation — NEVER to us as Gentiles. You ask, "Does being 'born-again' mean being saved?" No, not in God's eyes!" — cuz it isn't in the Scriptures in the manner it is being used today.)

Ok, let's put a little frosting on this one. See Romans 4:5-8. Today, anything we do 'wrong' based on Paul's teachings (Romans 2:16), is NOT imputed (charged) to us. The Lord does NOT impute sin to our record. We have been circumcised by the operation of God. We are dead to sin. Consider II Corinthians 5:21 – For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him. Does that verse make even better sense now?

So, as the original question stated, note the answer is: we are no longer considered fornicators, adulterers, liars, covetousness, etc. even if we were to follow that particular sin that dwelleth in us – none of that is imputed to us.

Bonus Bunny trail: The judgment seat of Christ... that is a judgment on our works, NOT a judgment of ourselves... correct? So, while we are clean because of the operation of God, etc., our works have yet to be 'tested' – 'judged' and that is the

purpose of the judgment seat of Christ – to judge our works! Read I Corinthians 3:10-15 if you are not familiar with this.

And, when it states ... the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is... in verse 13, remember Romans 2:16 because that tells us 'what sort it is' is referring to Paul's teachings, NOT the teachings from the gospels, not the beatitudes, nor from Hebrews to Jude, etc. That is why I am so 'Paul ONLY' in my belief and teachings and sermons, etc. What we learn from Paul is want counts because Paul's writings are what our works will be judged by!

So, the obvious thought that usually follows this great and miraculous understanding is...? "Can we just go out and party hearty?" Funny that you would ask that now because that very question is taken care of in the second half of Romans 6 – beginning with verse 15.
